

Reception Isolation Work Menu ~ Spring 2 2021

This half-term, the 'Isolation/Pod Closure' work is set through the 'Oak National Academy'- Maths & English links, and this grid focusing on other subjects.

The grid provides 10 learning activities based on Science, History, Geography, Art, Music & PE. There is enough for one activity a day over a maximum of two weeks (10 working days) 'Isolation/Pod Closure'

Remember ~ Children isolating, without symptoms, are well enough-and expected to- access work during school hours.

The school expects three pieces of work each day:

1 piece of Oak Academy Maths work, 1 piece of Oak Academy English work and 1 piece from another subject (this grid)

Weather Chart

Make a weather chart to show what the spring weather is like. Draw a picture of the weather each day for a week. You might also be able to add some labels too.



Draw an emoji

Using the emoji sheet below. Can you design and draw your own emoji that shows each of these emotions?
Talk with your adult about each emotion and how we can tell when someone is feeling each one.

Spring Song



You will need an adult to help you learn the 'Spring Song' attached below. Can you make up some actions to go with each of the verses. You could also make up some additional verses by thinking of other things that happen in Spring e.g. lambs are born, Easter etc.

No brush painting

Create a picture using paint and utensils from around your home. Collect items that you think will create interesting marks on the paper when dipped in paint. You might want to paint with a fork or a spoon, using tin foil or even a potato masher. See what different marks you can make.

Draw a flower

We would like you to do an observational drawing of a flower of your choice. You could choose a flower from your garden or use a photo from the internet. Look carefully at the different parts. Draw your flower using a pencil and then you can colour it in afterwards using the correct colours.



Traffic Light Game

Get physical with this game! You will need to stand in a space (inside or outside) and a family member will need to instruct the different traffic light movements.

Green- run around the room Red- Stop and freeze

Amber- Go slow You can explore different

ways of moving on 'green.' You could try crawling, jumping, rolling etc.

You might want to add some more instructions

Speed bump- jumping with 2 feet Reverse- travel backwards Flat tyre- lie on the floor Roundabout- spin around.

Puppet Show



Make some stick puppets by drawing the characters,

cutting them out and sticking them to a straw or lollypop stick. These could be characters from your favourite story that you act out or you could make up your own story/show. Once you have practised your show you can then perform it to your family! If you have an empty cardboard box you could even make a puppet theatre too!


Relay races



You can do this with your family members or time

yourself doing the race. Experiment with different ways of travelling. Can you run/crawl/hop/skip/jump? Add a ball or object. Can you throw and catch it? Can you balance the object on your head? Can you kick the ball? Add obstacles. Can you weave in and out/go under/over?

Nature bracelet





bracelet. Go into your garden and find natural items to stick on your bracelet. Look closely and talk about the items you collected. What do they look like? What patterns can you




see? What is the same/different about the items?
