

### PE and Sports Grant

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - has been allocated to primary school head teachers.

Each school receives approximately £8,000 plus an extra £5.00 per pupil each year.

## Purpose of funding

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

### Sports Grant Report 2013-14

The first year's funding was spent on bringing in specialist teachers for PE from Aspire.

# Sports Grant Report 2014-15

Whitnash Primary school has decided to use the money to:
