Dear Parents/Carers

This week has seen the exciting introduction of the school food weighing initiative. The children had an Eco-Assembly on Monday to introduce the need we all have to reduce our food waste. Important facts about the amount of food schools and homes throw away needlessly each year were shared. The environmental issues relating to this waste were discussed. We all agreed that far too much waste was being left on plates and ending up in the bin. The school is seizing the opportunity to not only educate our children about environmental issues, but also to encourage their healthy eating. We are finding that more and more children are developing issues about food and not understanding the importance of eating a healthy amount. Since this assembly, the children have been weighing the waste with scales and recording this. The aim is to motivate the children to reduce the amount being thrown away. We will keep you posted about how successful this initiative is in time.

We have had 'Change Starts With Us' workshops, in Year 1 through to 6, delivered by One Day Creative this week. This work is part of the annual and national Anti-Bullying Campaign schools are encouraged to participate in. These workshops have provided an exciting and fun approach to raising their awareness of responding positively with others and ensuring they know what to do if they are not happy about the behaviour of others towards them. These workshops have provided an great introduction to the National Anti-Bullying week next week, where children will continue to embark on work and activities relating to this. Many thanks to One Day Creative for the enjoyable and valuable sessions delivered to our children.

Well done to the children involved in Bikeability this week. 24 children from Year 5 and 6 have undertaken the first session of two in cycling proficiency. This is a super initiative and the children taking part have shown maturity and have been really engaged with learning new skills. This is a free annual programme for our children in Upper Key Stage 2. The children will receive certificates for their participation.


