These tasks follow on from the last English tasks so make sure those have all been completed first. I can't wait to see what you will produce!!!

Task 1: Theatre Design

The last task was to create your own puppet theatre. Look at the design and decorate sheet. Complete your theatre following the instructions and don't forget to take a photo of your finished theatre.

Task 2: Puppet Making.

You will need to create your shadow puppets for your performance. Look back at the last set of tasks, when you set out the characters. This will hopefully remind you about what needs to go into a shadow puppet performance. Use your scientific knowledge of light and shadows to create a set of puppets. Task 3 & 4: Script Writing

First of all watch this: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=cld pHJG5r8. Write your script for your puppet play. Ask members of your family to help you think about the character's voice. Rehearse this a few times so you are confident in retelling your story. When you have rehearsed a few times and you are definitely ready to perform, let the audience in your house know by designing and putting up posters and hand out tickets to the people coming.

Painting Your Shadow Puppet Theatre

- 1. If your box has any holes in it from last session, cover them over with either white sticky labels or a sheet of white paper which you can glue and then press down over your box.
- 2. Any writing on the box may show through when you paint so it is also a good idea to cover these areas as well.
- 3. If your box has any sticky tape on it, try to peel it off because the paint will not stick very well to the shiny surface.
- 4. Now choose a strong, rich, colour and paint all the outside surfaces of your box. Make sure you cover the cardboard thoroughly to get a really good finish!
- 5. Finally, once your box is dry, decorate the front of the theatre with a black marker pen
