Dear Parents / Carers,

As you will all be aware, we are currently considering all the guidance provided by the government relating to the potential return of some of our pupils in the weeks ahead. As you all know this is highly dependent of multiple, complex factors. We are all watching the daily briefings to see the impact of the relaxing of some lock down measures, and to see how this will effect the decision taken relating to schools. As you can imagine, the guidance and information schools are receiving is changing and evolving daily!

At this stage we cannot answer all of your questions relating to the potential reopening of schools, however, we want to reassure you that plans are being devised taking all of the guidance and possible scenarios into consideration to ensure that children's, staff and community safety are paramount. Despite changes and differing opinions on this matter, we are endeavouring to plan ways forward in the safest possible way for when any staged reintegration begins.

It is worth noting, that at this stage nothing has changed. We will be in a position to share detailed information in the forthcoming weeks, once we have consulted our Governors and the Local Authority. Please rest assured that a great deal of thought and careful consideration is being made at a school level, so that we will be in the best possible position to reduce any anxiety as and when any more pupils return. We thank you for your understanding and patience, and as soon as we have clearer central guidance and a definitive response we will be notifying you all.

In the meantime, we are keen to ensure we are supporting all our pupils and children. Teachers will be continuing to ring you all to check on children's learning and well-being.

We want to thank all of those of you who have engaged with the weekly newsletter. Darcy and Reagan made some wonderful stained glass window decorations.



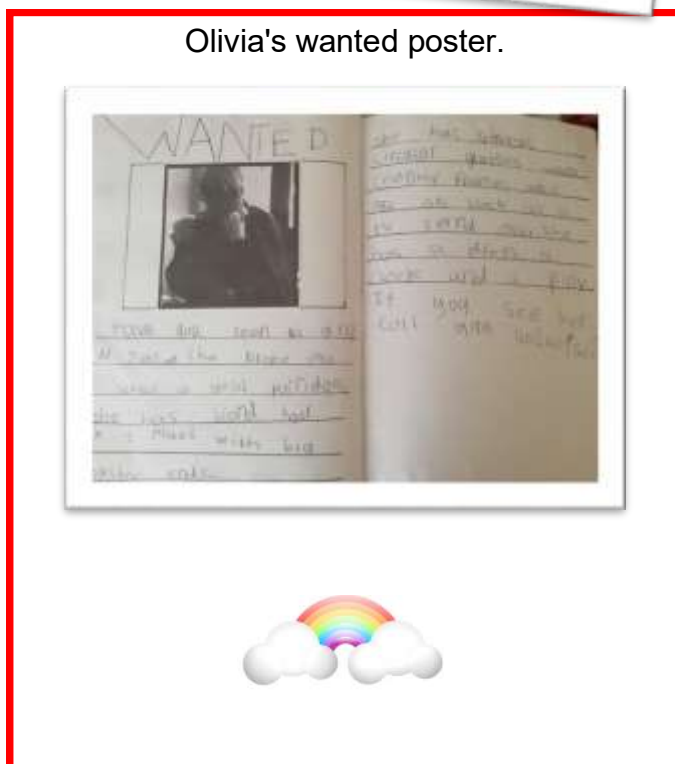
Daro has been very busy again this week.

Madison sailing through her fractions from her workbook!



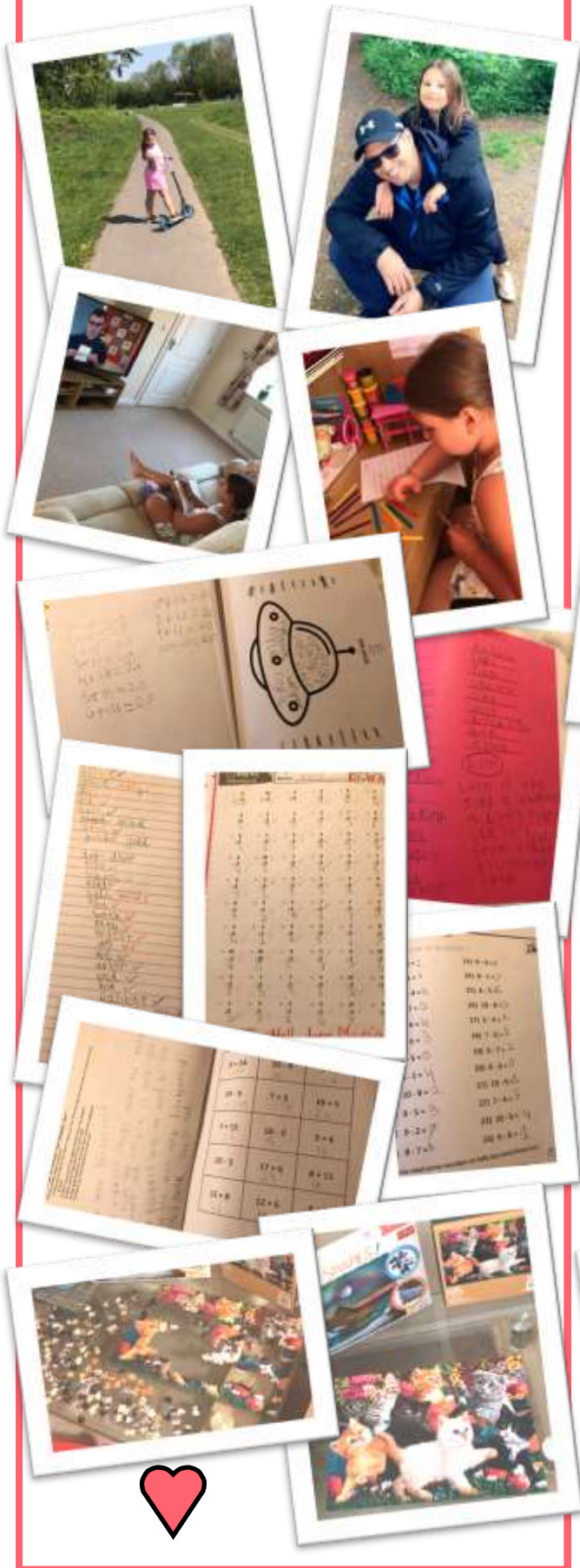

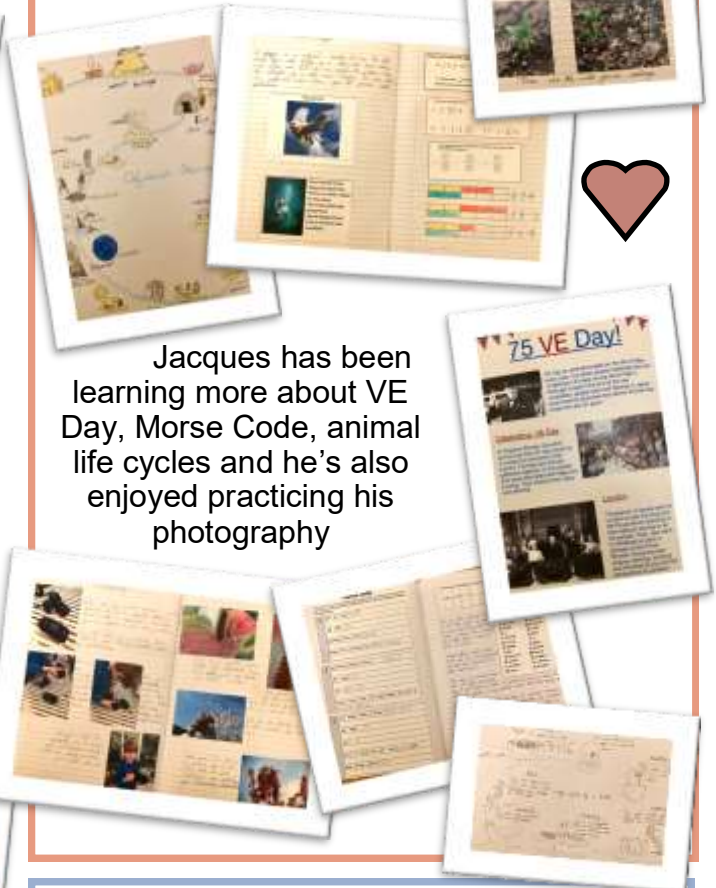




Maria has done some addition and subtraction, phonetic lessons, spell say write, went on a nature walk and did some puzzles with Mummy.
