




**Year 3 Menu Week beginning 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2020**

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths</b></p> <p>Use a dice to generate two 3-digit numbers. Subtract them using the column method. E.g.</p> $\begin{array}{r} 345 \\ 236 - \\ \hline \end{array}$ <p>Repeat this ten times!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths</b></p> <p>Choose a room in your house. Measure as actually as you can around the edge of the room. Which units are the most appropriate? Add the lengths to find the perimeter of the room!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths</b></p> <p>Using the numbers any numbers between 1-9 and +, -, ÷, x. Can you make the target number 543? How many different ways can you make the target number? Choose a different target number and repeat.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths</b></p> <p>Use a dice to generate two 3-digit numbers. Add them together using the column method. E.g.</p> $\begin{array}{r} 345 \\ 236 + \\ \hline \end{array}$ <p>Repeat this ten times!</p>

Your partner chooses a number for you and keeps it a secret. You then ask lots of questions to try and work out what the number is. E.g. Is it odd? Is it a multiple of 3? Is it under 20?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths</b></p> <p>Choose 10 objects to weigh around the house. Record the weight in grams. Put them in order. What is the difference between the lightest and heaviest weights?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths</b></p> <p>Play the fractions game. <p><b>English</b></p> <p>Write a Kenning all about a volcano. Remember to only use 2 words on each line. E.g.</p> <p>Skin-burner</p> <p>Drought-maker</p> <p>Plant-feeder</p>	<p><b>English</b></p> <p>Write a book review for a book that you have just finished. Make sure you include whether you recommend it or not and why. Remember to include a picture of your favourite part of the book.</p>	<p><b>GPS</b></p> <p>Write a series of metaphors for things you can see at home or in the garden. Remember to use 'is a/an' or 'was a/an'.</p> <p><i>The shower is an Amazonian raincloud.</i></p>	<p><b>Spelling</b></p> <p>Learn the spellings and meaning of these words linked to our topic:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• permeable</li> <li>• absorbent</li> <li>• sedimentary</li> <li>• igneous</li> </ul>
<p><b>English</b></p> <p>Create a poster all about tsunamis. Remember to use lots of marvellous facts and well-presented pictures.</p> <p>Here's an example poster.</p> 	<p><b>English</b></p> <p>It's almost Easter!!!!</p> <p>Write a Haiku about all the wonderful, natural things that happen at Easter time. Remember to count the syllables in the 3 lines:</p> <p>An old silent pond (5)</p> <p>A frog jumps into the pond (7)</p> <p>splash! Silence again (5)</p>	<p><b>GPS</b></p> <p>Write a series of similes that describe and compare things that you can see at home or in the garden. Remember to use 'as' or 'like' correctly.</p> <p><i>The TV is as loud as a megaphone.</i></p> <p><i>My homework book is full like a neatly trimmed hedge.</i></p>	<p><b>Spelling</b></p> <p>Choose 10 interesting words from the book you are reading and look up their definition. Record neatly in your work book. Remember to spell EVERY word correctly!</p>
