Topic Use the internet to research or Collect as many leaflets about Royal Leamington Spa as you can and read them. Write down the most interesting things you find out in each one.	Topic Talk to someone who grew up in Leamington or Whitnash. Find out about all the things that have changed since they were little. Together write down what you find out.	Topic Visit a place of interest in Leamington (the art gallery and museum, any of the theatres, the library, the Glass house in Jephson's Gardens, etc) and write a review of your visit. Include what you learnt, what you liked/didn't like and who you would recommend it to.
Science Look in your garden or a local park. Find out the names of 5 different plants that grow there. Draw a picture of each one. Think about how much light, warmth and water they get. Note any differences.	Science Create an information text about what plants need in order to grow well. Include use the features of an information text (title, subheading, etc). You could present this as a poster.	Topic Local History Research one of the people who have been honored with a Blue Plaque on the side of a building in the area. Find out who they were, what they were famous for and why there is a plaque there. (e.g. B Satchwell, Dr Jephson, Sir F Whittle, H. Tandey)	PSHE Make a safety leaflet. It should be 2 sides of A4 and include advice for children on how to keep safe. Choose ONE of these topics Internet safety Keeping safe in the sun Road safety
Art Draw a sketch of a Regency building - Note the features that make it Regency in style.	Science Plant life cycle Find out about the life cycle of a plant and make a poster or model to demonstrate how it happens.	Maths Time Time how long it takes you to clean you to eat your dinner each day for a week. Then order the times from longest to shortest time. Then say how much longer it took from one day to the next in minutes and seconds.	English Write a story about someone who time travels from Regency Leamington (around 1800) to modern times and lands in your home! What would they say and do - what things would surprise them? Where would you take them?
Maths Write a timetable for a day - say what time you do each thing. Include am and pm.	Topic Find an old map of the local area, be clear on what year it is from. Can you find your home on it? If it not there, what WAS there at that time?	Maths - Time Rewrite your timetable from the activity in the first column or create a new one. This time, write the time in the 24-hour clock.
