
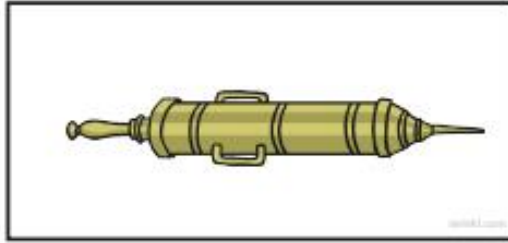




Year 1 Great Fire of London Topic

<p><u>History</u> Take a look at the pictures below of the different types of equipment used by a firefighter now and then. Can you put them into two groups (1666 and 2021) and label what they are used for?</p>	<p><u>P.E</u> Can you create a series of exercises (called a circuit) for yourself to do? Can you write them down or draw them in the correct order? Time yourself and then time a member of the family -who is the quickest?</p>	<p><u>Art</u> Can you find a collection of different coloured materials eg foil, gold paper, felt, different coloured tissue paper etc? Decide which colours you could use to create a warm collage and which you would use for a cold collage. Can you now create a collage of fire or ice using the colours you chose?</p>	<p><u>Science/ DT</u> One of the main ways to transport things is on the River Thames in London. Can you design and make a boat? Can you test it in a bowl of water to see if it floats? Can you now add some pieces of lego as cargo - will it still float? Can you write a list of equipment you need and instructions on how to make it? How could you improve your design?</p>
<p><u>PSHE/ DT</u> We know the fire started in a bakery - what is a bakery? Can you find out what happens inside a bakery ? You could then use the attached recipe to have a go at making some bread at home?</p>	<p><u>Music</u> Listen to the song "London's Burning". It is based on the Great Fire of London. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=5Atpbo3wOts Can you learn the song and sing it? Perhaps you can draw some pictures to illustrate it. What do you like about the song? What don't you like about the song? Challenge: Can you make up your own song to the tune of "London's Burning"?</p>	<p><u>RE</u> Our topic in RE is called, "Who is a Christian and what do they believe? Can you either- Find five facts about Christians and what they believe or choose your own religion and make a list of five facts about your religion?</p>	<p><u>PSHE</u> In class we were thinking about belonging. We discussed groups we belong to (family, class, school, football club, Brownies, Cubs etc). Choose a group you belong to and create a badge to represent the group.</p>
<p><u>Science</u> Wind played a big role in spreading the Fire in London. Can you make a weather vane to see which way and how quickly the wind is blowing?</p>  <p><u>You will need-</u> 2 pieces of paper, a straw, a pencil and pin or cello tape.</p> <p>Cut a circle and label it North, South, East and West. Cut a triangle and attach it to the end of the straw. Make a hole in the middle of your circular paper and push the pencil through. Using a pin or cello tape attach the straw to the top of the pencil. Place the bottom of the pencil in the ground or in a pot and watch your arrow go round.</p>		<p><u>Topic</u> https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=MUDAUa0XSHI Take a look of the tour of London with William. Bread in a bag Recipe

150g Strong flour

$\frac{1}{2}$ tsp yeast

$\frac{1}{2}$ tsp sugar

$\frac{1}{4}$ tsp salt

1 tbsp oil

75ml warm water

- Place a zip close bag on the scales.
- Put the dry ingredients in the bag and shake bag.
- Add oil and water and close bag.
- Knead ingredients in bag for 10 to 15 mins until the ingredients form a dough.
- Open bag and place dough in a foil tray within the bag.
- Seal bag tightly and leave to prove for about 2 hours.
- Remove dough and tray from the bag.
- Place the dough in the tray in a pre-heated oven (190 C).
- Bake for 20 - 25 mins.
- Remove from oven, allow to cool. ENJOY!
