MATHS

Children will be introduced to 4 digit numbers, negative numbers and Roman Numerals. They will be rounding numbers to 10,100s and 1000s, and comparing, ordering before adding and taking away using formal column methods.

HISTORY

We will be finding out about the achievements of one of the earliest civilisations by undertaking an in depth study of the Ancient Egyptians. Children will raise questions about the time and use a variety of sources to find out about aspects of life including food, clothing, work and religious beliefs. They will compare the lives of slaves and Pharaohs and significant events in this time period.
