You have settled into year 6 so so well and have worked fabulously! You are a joy to have in our class; you are funny, kind and I love being your teacher! Well done on a super term!





Meet Geronimo – the baby penguin who has one dream and one dream only – and that is to fly!


But everyone knows penguins can't fly... or can they?
