<u>Fact families - Associated</u> <u>divisions</u>

- 1. Choose an addition fact.
- 2. Write out the different linked facts. e.g:25+75=100, 75+25=100, 100-25=75, 100-75=25

Practice: Try it with other facts
Challenge: How quickly can you answer
10 subtraction questions using related
facts?

Calculation ~ Countdown

- 1. Think of a target number (12 435)
- 2. Using the digits 0-9 and the operations + x ÷, write a set of calculations and try to make the make the number

Only use each digit once. You can use the operations more than once

Practice: Pick a new target number each day and try again

Challenge: Try and get faster or try and do less calculations

<u>Place Value ~ Round to 10,</u> 100,1000, 10 000

- 1. Ask anyone at home to help you think of **ten** 5-digit numbers.
- 2. Write the numbers down.
- Round all the numbers to the nearest ten, hundred and thousand

Practice: Get ten new numbers and try again another time
Challenge: Try 6-digit numbers rounded to 10, 100, 1000 & 10 000

<u>Calculation ~ Perimeter</u>

1. Draw as many different rectangles you can with, using a ruler, with a perimeter of 24cm

Practice: Pick a different number of coins each day and try again.

Place Value ~ Ordering

- Ask anyone at home to help you think of ten 6-digit numbers.
- 2. Write the numbers down.
- 3. Order the numbers from largest to smallest
- 4. Work out the difference between each number

Practice: Get ten new numbers and try again another time. Can you order them smallest to largest?

Challenge: Try 7-digit numbers.

Calculation ~ Addition

- 1. Start with the 'Got It' target 432.
- 2. Each player chooses a whole number from 1 to 4.
- 3. Players take turns to add a whole number from 1 to 4 to the running total.
- 4. The player who hits the target of 432 wins the game.

Practice: Pick a different number each day and try again
Challenge: Try with higher totals

Place Value ~ what's my number?

- 1. Player 1 (You or another player from home) chooses a number.
- 2. Player 2 asks questions to help work out the secret number
- Player one can only answer yes or no

Example

Player 2"Is it over 50?" Player 1"Yes"
Practice: Choose numbers each day
Challenge: guess the number with 10
questions.

Calculation

What could the question be if the answer is 69?

- 1. Focus on the question above
- 2. Write as many calculations as to answer it

Practice: Pick a different number for the answer each day and try again **Challenge:** Just use multiplication and division.

English

Spellings ~ Mini Tests

- 1. Choose a set of spellings, to practice, from the spelling sheet
- 2. Write them out in a list
- 3. Get someone at home to check it then test you each day.

Practice: Test each day until you are scoring 100%

Challenge: Use these in sentences or a story

Biography: Writing

- Choose a famous person you know a lot about e.g. Marcus Rashford
- 2. Write a biography, using paragraphs to organise your information

Practice: pick another person and try again

Challenge: Add pictures to add interest to your writing.

Spellings ~ Hangman

- Choose a spelling from the spelling sheet
- 2. Write dashes for the number of letters _ _ _ _
- 3. Get a partner to guess the letters then spelling.

Practice: You always do the guessing
Challenge: Ignore the list and
choose adventurous words.

Stories ~ Comic strip

- Choose a book to read or an appropriate film to watch
- 2. Create a comic strip retelling the story.

Practice: pick another book/film and try again

Challenge: Try to use amazing adjectives and adverbs as in the SPAG tasks.

SPAG ~ verbs

- 1. Write a story about fireworks night.
- 2. Circle all the verbs you have used.
- 3. Choose more interesting and exciting verbs to replace them with.

Practice: Write a different story and repeat

Challenge: Circle and improve the adjectives

Stories ~ Writing

- Choose a book to read or an appropriate film to watch
- 2. Re-write the complete story

Practice: pick another book/film and try again

Challenge: Try to use amazing adjectives and adverbs as in the SPAG tasks.

SPAG ~ Adverbs

- Copy out a section of your reading book
- 2. Circle all the all adverbs
- 3. Write a new sentence for each adverb.

Practice: pick a different section and try again

Challenge: Write a story with

exciting adverbs

Reading ~ Reviews

- Choose a new book to read or a favourite you have read
- 2. Write a letter to the author telling him/her what you like about the book.

Practice: pick another book and try again

Challenge: Imagine you are the author

and write a reply!
