



Make an obstacle course

Create your course either inside or outside. You will need obstacles that you can go over, under, around and through. You might want to add different actions/exercises you do at certain points e.g. jump 5 times, spin around etc. You could even ask a family member to time you and then see if you can beat this time when you do it again!

Build a bridge

Your challenge is to build a bridge for the gingerbread man so that he can safely cross the river without having to go with the fox! You might use Lego, blocks, cardboard boxes, tubes from your recycling.



Evening walk

Go for a walk with your adult once it has got dark. *What can you see? Look up at the sky.*

What lights can you see? What is making the light? What can you hear?

You could go out for your walk with your pyjamas on



under your coat! Remember to hold hands with your adult.

Magic carpet ride

Get a blanket/towel/duvet and lay it on the floor. Use your imaginations and pretend you are off on a magical adventure!

What might you take with you?

Where are you going?

What can you see/hear/smell?

Take a family member with you on your magical journey, enjoy!

You might like to bake your own yummy gingerbread men. We have attached a recipe for you below.



Design a gingerbread house

Draw/paint/collage a house that a gingerbread person might live in. Make sure it is decorated with lots of sweet treats!



Drawing to music

Drawing to sounds and music can be a lovely listening activity. You can 'dance with your hands' whilst using crayons, pencils, felt tips, paint brushes. Listen carefully to the music and move your hands however you want to according to how the music makes you feel.

You can explore this with different types of music. Does the music affect how you draw/paint? What is your favourite music?

Material hunt

Use the sheet attached below to go on a scavenger hunt around your home, garden or even when out on a walk. Record what you find. You could draw a picture, take a photo, write the word or ask an adult to record for you. Happy hunting! 😊



Make your own shop

Gingerbread People

Make your own delicious and unique gingerbread people!



Makes approx. 15–25 gingerbread people.

Ingredients

350g plain flour
100g butter
5 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp ground ginger
1 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp ground cinnamon
1 tsp bicarbonate soda
175g light brown sugar
4 tbsp golden syrup
1 medium egg
For the decoration:
225g icing sugar
2–3 tbsp warm water
Food colouring
Range of sweets and cake decorations for features

Equipment

Oven
Baking tray
Baking parchment
Large bowl
Small bowl
Wooden spoon
People-shaped cutters
Sieve


Method

1. Preheat your oven to 180°C/gas mark 4.
2. Place the flour, butter, ginger, cinnamon and bicarbonate of soda in a mixing bowl and mix with your fingers until it looks like breadcrumbs.
3. Add the sugar, syrup and egg to the bowl and mix with a wooden spoon until a firm dough is formed.
4. Turn out the dough onto a floured surface.
5. Using a rolling pin, roll the dough to about 5mm thick.
6. Use people-shaped cutters to cut out people shapes.
7. Place your gingerbread people on a lined baking tray and bake for around 10–15 minutes or until they are golden brown.
8. Allow your gingerbread people to cool.

For the decoration

9. Sieve the icing sugar into a bowl.
10. Using a wooden spoon, gradually stir in enough water until the icing is white, smooth and thick enough to coat the back of the spoon.
11. Mix in some food colouring, if you like.
12. Ice and decorate your biscuits to make them into special and unique gingerbread people!
13. Enjoy!
