Dear Parents / Carers,

It has been another successful week at school with children responding brilliantly to the new arrangements. I have been able to visit each class, maintaining a social distance so not to breach our Quad Pods, and held an assembly with each class. We discussed their experiences during lock down, who they could talk to if they needed support and why the school is the way it is for now. Their level of understanding and maturity was astounding from Year 1 all the way to Year 6!

Homework Learning Logs have been sent out today with a letter about our normal homework arrangements. The menus can also be found on the school website under the 'Curriculum' tab, then 'Home Learning'. We will ensure that from next week, the website contains work that can be accessed by all children in the event of school absence due to COVID-19.

I want to thank parents this week for your understanding of what we are trying so hard to achieve at Whitnash during this COVID-19 pandemic. As you are aware the national R-rate is a continual battle for us all to contend with. Our ambition through our tight measures is that Whitnash will be able to remain open and we can consistently be able to maintain education for all pupils in school. However, to do this we need to ensure our Quad Pods remain as consistent as possible. In school this is working well, which provides us with the confidence that if a child tests positive, we will be able to track and trace their contacts in school easily. However to make this really meaningful it requires parents and school to be working together.

In the mornings we have had reports from residents and other parents, that children are not waiting with their parents. They are leaving their parents side and mixing with children that are not in their Quad Pod. This creates an issues as it is a point of transition for the virus. Whilst, I appreciate that school cannot influence what social arrangements are being made by families, the most ideal is that children socially distance wherever possible. We know that other schools and regions are having to close schools again due to teachers becoming infected and children testing positive. We are trying to ensure that this is not the outcome in our school. Please do all you can to support us in this mission.

Our greatest fear is that children are not socially distancing and our staff may become unwell. Whilst we know that the virus is mild in children or asymptomatic, we know that it is not necessarily the same for all adults. Please help us to protect our staff and your children's

Don't let your child miss out on school milk after their 5th birthday

When your child turns 5, your child's supply of free milk finishes. However, if you would like to pay for your child to receive milk we have made arrangements with Cool Milk to supply milk at a subsidised cost of just 22p per day.

What you need to do:

Visit www.coolmilk.com as soon as possible and select "Register your child for milk here", then follow the on-screen instructions to register and pay.

If your child is registered for Free School Meals (i.e. NOT the Universal Free School Meals) the school can continue to supply your child with free milk. Please let the office know if you wish this to continue.

Parent Pay is not only a system for paying in money, it is also our main source for communication with parents and carers and we would not want you to miss important information


